



Completing and submitting a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the single most important thing you can do to get assistance paying for college (U.S. Department of Education). The application is free and can be accessed at <http://fafsa.ed.gov>.

The U.S. Department of Education uses the FAFSA to determine students' eligibility for federal student aid. Every year, the federal government awards about \$150 billion in the form of grants, work-study funds, and low-interest loans to help millions of students pay for college (U.S. Department of Education).
